Key Difference – Prepositions vs Conjunctions

1-A preposition refers to a word that is used with a noun or pronoun to show place, position, time or method. A preposition is usually placed in front of a noun.

Key Difference – Prepositions vs Conjunctions

2- On the other hand, a conjunction refers to a word that creates a connection between words, clauses or phrases.

After is used in the following ways:

- as a **preposition** (followed by a noun)
- as a conjunction (connecting two clauses)
- as an adverb (without a following noun):

The word after can be used as a preposition.

When it is used as a preposition, it is followed by a noun.

- I went to the grocery store after work.
- After the party, he went back to the home.

The word after can be used as a conjunction.

• After can also be used as a conjunction. As a conjunction after connects two clauses.

- After she finished her studies, she went back home.
- He arrived after everybody had gone home.
